CAPITALISM WITH CHINESE CHARACTERISTICS:

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HOW TO VIEW THE HISTORY IN THE PAST 35 YEARS

- In reality: Retreats from socialism and advances toward capitalism
- In official discourse: changed from orthodox socialism to socialism with Chinese characteristics and rejects capitalism
- There is a huge gap between the official discourse and the reality

CHINA IN THE 1980S: HOW TO SAVE SOCIALISM?

- Market economy is something that can save socialism
- · How market economy can ex-exist with socialism?

FROM ORTHODOX SOCIALISM TO THE PRIMARY STAGE OF SOCIALISM

The orthodox socialism is defined as:

- Distribution based on work
- ·Planned economy
- ·Public ownership

FROM ORTHODOX SOCIALISM TO THE PRIMARY STAGE OF SOCIALISM

The primary stage of socialism:

- •Due to the underdevelopment of economy, science and technology, regional disparities, and incomplete political system
- •Timespan: From 1956 to the mid-21st century

FROM SOCIALISM TO THE PRIMARY STAGE OF SOCIALISM

- Deng Xiaoping redefined socialism: socialism is common prosperity
- Market economy can be adopted as a tool for this goal

FROM SOCIALISM TO THE PRIMARY STAGE OF SOCIALISM

- The new definition of socialism removes one of two main distinctions between socialism and capitalism: planned economy vs. market economy
- Public ownership: another element of socialism remains obscured

FROM SOCIALISM TO THE PRIMARY STAGE OF SOCIALISM

Socialism and market economy:

- •The debate on socialism and commodity economy in the 1980s
- •The adoption of socialist market economy in 1992:

Let market play a fundamental role in resource allocation under the guidance of state macro-regulation

•Moved further on the road of market economy in 2012:

Let market play a decisive role in resource allocation

FROM SOCIALISM TO SOCIALISM WITH CHINESE CHARACTERISTICS

 Socialism with Chinese characteristics became the new label of socialism

FROM SOCIALISM TO SOCIALISM WITH CHINESE CHARACTERISTICS

- Socialism with Chinese characteristics: socialism without planned economy and public ownership?
 - ♦ what is not included:
 - planned economy
 - public ownership
 - ♦ What is included:
 - ◆ Pursuing the goal of common prosperity and socialist modernization
 - ◆ The leadership of the party

SOCIALISM IN REALITY

What happened after 35 years of practice of new version of socialism: common prosperity:

- ·High Gini coefficient
- Deteriorating social disparities
- ·A vibrant but chaotic market

SOCIALISM IN REALITY

The rapidly lowered share of the public sector in the economy

Private sector SOEs

Employments (2013) 219 million 36million

GDP more than 60% 25-30%

Tax (2010) 83% 17%

CHANGING REALITY, CHANGING LEGITIMACY

• The source of legitimacy determines the definition of socialism

CCP: FROM AN ISM PARTY TO A PARTY WITHOUT ISM

- From communism to orthodox socialism to socialism with Chinese characteristics
- The evolution of the notion of socialism manifests de-ideologization of the party

CHINA: FROM CAPITALISM TO CAPITALISM

 After 65 years of searching, China is on the road back to capitalism

CAPITALISM WITH CHINESE CHARACTERISTICS?

- Capitalism is totally rejected in language but partly accepted in reality by the party:
- · What is totally accepted: market economy
- · What is partly accepted: private ownership
- · What is rejected: unclear
- The concept of capitalism is as vague as that of socialism

WHY CAPITALISM WITH CHINESE CHARACTERISTICS?

- An incomplete market economy—the unchecked power and an unregulated market in which three forces play their role: normal market force, power, and barbaric market force
- · The inequality
- · Re-classification of the society
- · Market economy under the leadership of the party
